1. Why have an EOI process?

- Applicants should have demonstrated experience in the health system (e.g., qualifications and experience in nursing, allied health, medicine, quality improvement, health services management, health economics, public health, health policy, behavioural medicine etc.)
- SHP has designed the Masterclass as a practical introduction to the science of implementation for health professionals and health researchers. The aim is to build capacity and expertise across SHP through providing an in-depth introduction to Implementation Science within the healthcare system.

2. Why do I need to conduct my research within a Sydney Health Partners (SHP) partner organisation?

 There is significant demand for Implementation Science education and training opportunities in Australia and there is limited capacity in the SHP Masterclass. The Masterclass aims to support and build capacity in Implementation Science while still ensuring a focus on the clinical priorities of our Partners.
